7th Grade Summer Bible Project

For this year's summer Bible project, we will be going through and answering questions on Psalm 119. This is the longest chapter in the Bible and a lot of good content is overlooked due to its size. Like last year's project, we will be splitting it up over the course of 7 weeks.

We will be using the **King James Version (KJV)**. You can either write or type out your answers, either is fine. (Please label each set of questions by its week.) **The assignment will be turned** in via Google Classroom the first week of school for a test grade.

Answer each question in complete sentences.

Week 1

Read through Psalm 119:1-24

- 1. What does it mean to keep the LORD's testimonies?
- 2. What does it mean to seek the LORD with your whole heart?
- 3. According to verse 9, how shall a young man cleanse his way?
- 4. In these verses, the author expresses his love for the Word of God. Why do you think this is so important to the author?

Week 2

Read Psalm 119:25-48

- 1. Read and explain verse 33-34
- 2. What is covetousness?
- 3. What does it mean in verse 37, "turn my eyes away from vanity"?
- 4. What does it mean to meditate on God's statutes?

Week 3

Read **Psalm 119:49-72**

- 1. Read and explain verses 52-56.
- 2. Read and explain verses 62-64
- 3. What does the author mean when he says it was good for him to have been afflicted?
- 4. Why would the author view the Word of God as more valuable than much gold and silver?

Week 4

Read Psalm 119:73-96

- 1. In verse 73, what does the author ask God for to learn God's commandments?
- 2. Read and explain verses 89-91.
- 3. According to verse 92, why is it important to love the Word of God?

Week 5

Read **Psalm 119:97-120**

- 1. What does the author compare the Word of God to in verse 103?
- 2. Does verse 105 sound familiar? Why do you think this is included in the pledge to the Bible?
- 3. Read vs 113. Explain the contrast between vain thoughts and the Word of God.
- 4. How does verse 114 describe God?

Read **Psalm 119:121-144**

- 1. Read and explain verse 130. How does the word of God give light and understanding to the simple?
- 2. Notice the contrast described in verse 133. How can we implement this in our lives?
- 3. What is zeal? What does it mean in verse 139?

Week 7

Read Psalm 119:145-176

- 1. Explain verse 151.
- 2. Notice the contrast in verse 163. How can we implement this in our lives?
- 3. The final section is verses 169-176. What is the author asking God in this section?
- 4. The author of this psalm loved the LORD and shunned evil and that was made evident over these many verses. What are some ways we can have this mindset today?
